BACTERIAL MENINGITIS and SUSPECTED MENINGOCOCCAL SEPSIS

Immediate management

- Immediately refer all people with suspected meningococcal disease (meningitis with non-blanching rash or meningococcal septicaemia) or bacterial meningitis (without a non-blanching rash) to hospital
- Give antibiotic before transport to hospital, as long as this does not delay the transfer
 - o 1st choice antibiotic Benzylpenicillin
 - Child < one year: 300 mg IV or IM
 - Child one to nine years: 600 mg IV or IM
 - Adult and child > ten years: 1.2 g IV or IM
 - o 2nd choice antibiotic Ceftriaxone
 - Adult and child: 50 100 mg/kg up to 2 g IV or IM
