Alcohol Withdrawal (AW) vs Delirium Tremens (DT)

Feature	AW (general withdrawal)	DT (severe withdrawal subtype)
Timing after last drink	6-24 hr (peak 24-48 hr)	~48-96 hr (often day 3-4)
Consciousness	Alert / oriented ± anxious	Confusion, disorientation, delirium
Hallucinations	± visual/tactile, insight may remain	Vivid hallucinations, no insight
Autonomic signs	↑ HR, tremor, sweaty, nausea	Very high HR (>120), high BP, fever
Tremor	Fine, common	Coarse, marked
Seizures	6–24h early withdrawal seizures	Can occur but DT = delirium + autonomic storm
Risk	Moderate	Life■threatening emergency
Management setting	Often outpatient if mild + safe	ED/ICU – benzodiazepines + supportive + thian

Mnemonic: DT = Delirium + Tremor + Tachycardia + Temperature

Clinical pearl: All DT is alcohol withdrawal, but not all alcohol withdrawal is DT.
